## **Resources for Obtaining Student Data**

Many grants require information about the pool of students relevant to the proposed project. Metrics might include the number of students in a major, demographics (e.g., ethnicity, gender, income, first-generation status), retention and graduation rates, or non-academic factors such as mental health needs.

Here are some of your options for gathering this information on students:



### **Big Picture Data Sets**

Explore University Analytics & Institutional Research (UAIR) student data fact books.

#### **Departmental Sources**

Consult with the <u>Assistant Dean for Research</u> in the relevant college or school, or the director of student advising for the department.

#### **Fine-Grain Student Data**

For complex or detailed data sets (e.g., students enrolled in multiple degree programs who are lowincome and from an underrepresented minority group), contact UAIR at least six weeks before your data is needed; more urgent requests cannot be guaranteed. Start by filling out the <u>Data Request</u> <u>Form</u>, and specify that the request is for a grant proposal.

#### **Other Consultants**
