Buprenorphine Update

Due to intermittent availability of various buprenorphine formulations, the IACUC is offering flexibility with approved options for analgesia in mice and rats. Ensure all options are listed in your protocol. For additions, contact the Animal Welfare Program (AWP) office for a quick amendment. Each formulation provides comparable pain relief, though formulation type may impact research outcomes. For questions, feel free to teach out to the AWP office or UAC veterinary team.

No Tricks, Just Transparency: What Is a PAM Visit?

Have you heard about PAM (Post-Approval Monitoring) visits but aren't quite sure what they are? A PAM visit is part of our effort to ensure compliance and support the ongoing success of your research. It is independent of the IACUC semi-annual inspections. During a PAM visit, a representative from our office will visit your lab to:

- Review procedures and ensure they align with your approved protocol.
- Offer guidance on any potential updates or improvements.
- Answer questions and provide support to ensure you have everything you need for successful research.

PAM visits are not inspections or audits but rather an opportunity to promote best practices and ensure you're well-supported. The visit gives our office an opportunity to meet you and your lab to learn about your research, which helps us better assist you in the future.
























October FAQ and POLL
