




**Human subjects training** is required for all investigators, faculty, staff, and students conducting research with human subjects at the University of Arizona. The IRB will not approve protocols unless all research team members have completed current and appropriate human subjects training.

There are two Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) program courses to choose from, depending on the type of research:



HSPB requires all study team members involved in **FDA-regulated research** or **accessing medical records** to complete the Biomedical Research Investigators Basic Course.

For all other research, HSPB will accept either the Biomedical or the Social Behavioral human subjects research training course.

- CITI training is valid for **four (4) years**, after which refresher training must be completed.
- Remember to keep a copy of your training certificate for your records.

## Research Involving Native or Indigenous Populations

All study team members engaged in research involving Native Americans or Indigenous populations, including projects that intentionally target Native populations for participation, involve genetic testing that may reveal tribal affiliation, or could lead to conclusions about a Native Nation, must also complete the [Tribal Consultation Policy Training](#) course through the University of Arizona [EDGE Learning](#) platform.
