

In accordance with Arizona Board of Regents ("ABOR") Policy 3-901(B), "[t]he University must identify, on a case-by-case basis, individual and institutional conflicts of interest and conflicts of commitment that may arise as a result of [a] proposed transfer [of technology to employees or regents]."


If you are a potential licensee of University-owned IP, you must complete the Enabling Disclosure Worksheet and disclose:

- Description of the licensed technology
- Identity of individuals who will work for or have an interest in the company
- The company's structure and activities
- Whether and how students will be involved
- How and to what extent the company expects to interact with the University


<u>NOTE</u>: After becoming a licensee of University-owned IP, you will have a continuing duty to disclose information about your research via the COI Program's online disclosure process. Going forward, the COI Program and the COI Committee will evaluate each of your research proposals and projects involving the University against your interest in the start-up.

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST MAY ARISE WHEN:

- The company subcontracts, sponsors, or supports research at the University
- The company owns or licenses the product or technology being evaluated in research at the University
- University research could affect or appear to affect the value of the company itself or your remuneration from the company (e.g. royalty income)
- University research could directly benefit the company







Conflicts can be inevitable and are expected when an individual is commercializing Intellectual Property. Transparency throughout this process makes necessary interventions quicker and more targeted.
