

COMMITMENT TO EXPORT CONTROL

We recognize developing relationships in the worldwide academic and business community are critical to our mission as a research university. International partnerships are at the forefront of our mind as we seek to balance global innovation and compliance with export control regulations.

The University of Arizona – as a top research university – is committed to complying with U.S. federal export control regulations. Federal export controls govern the shipment, transfer, and access of export-controlled data, items, equipment, materials, and software to non-U.S. Persons or entities (domestically and abroad). In addition, there are sanctions and embargoes on transactions or exchanges with designated countries, entities, and individuals. Violations of these laws can result in significant fines and penalties.

In order to support your research and international activities, the University's Export Control is here help you navigate the federal regulations. Research Innovation & Impact's (RII) Export Control website has multiple resources for the campus community engaging in the following activities:

- Collaborating with institutions, individuals, or entities located outside the U.S;
- Activities involving controlled items (data, items, equipment, materials, and software);
- Participating in projects with restrictions (i.e. publication, foreign national, CUI, etc.);
- Foreign national access to controlled information or items abroad or in the U.S;
- Shipping or hand-carrying information or items abroad (data, items, equipment, materials, and software);
- Accessing or emailing export-controlled data when outside the U.S.; and
- Transactions, including online classes abroad, and travel to sanctioned and embargoed countries (primarily Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Sudan, and Syria).
